7. We strongly advise you to register as soon as possible to secure a seat in your classes. Please be aware that low-enrollment classes will be canceled, and available seats can fill up quickly.
8. Once classes are full, overallsies will not be given. This policy applies to all undergraduate and graduate students, including graduating seniors.
9. Shortly before the semester begins, the Registrar will drop all students who lack the proper prerequisites. If the class is full at that time, you will not be able to register for it, even with instructor approval to waive the prerequisites. Therefore, it is critical that you pass any prerequisite courses you are currently taking.
