A New Submission Approach: Individual Proposals Only

To simplify the submission process and maximize the opportunity for faculty to share their work in an interdisciplinary context, we are asking for **individual proposals only**. The Faculty Day Conference Committee will group all accepted proposals into interdisciplinary panels and thematic sessions in the following formats:

- **Interdisciplinary Panels.** 75-minute sessions that focus on a central theme determined by the committee, featuring perspectives from three different presenters from various disciplines. Format: 3 speakers + 1 Moderator. Speaker Time: Approximately 15 to 18 minutes per presenter, followed by 15 minutes of cross-talk and Q&A.
- **Lightning Talks / Popcorn Sessions.** A fast-paced, high-energy format designed for sharing works-in-progress, early findings, or a single powerful idea. These sessions are a great low-stakes opportunity for all faculty. Format: 5 or 6 speakers per session. Speaker Time: 5 to 7 minutes per speaker, followed by a 5-minute Q&A dedicated to that speaker.
- **Creative Works, Roundtable, & Poster Sessions.** We will continue to offer dedicated sessions for performance, literary readings, academic poster presentations, and art gallery displays (photos, paintings, sculpture, crafts and other media), as well as luncheon roundtable topics for informal discussion.

Tracks and Priorities – We want to showcase the faculty's robust research and creative output. This is a great opportunity to present your research or creative works to a multidisciplinary audience of colleagues outside of your immediate field.

Works in progress or those previously presented at disciplinary conferences are welcome.

Note on pedagogy-related proposals: Robust pedagogical programming is available through the Center for Teaching and Learning (CTL). Proposals focused on pedagogy may be grouped into sessions sponsored by the CTL.
