Program Requirements

SUST + MSCP Admissions Requirements

- Must be officially accepted in the Bachelor of Arts in Urban Sustainability (SUST).
- Completion of 75 credits and a cumulative GPA of 3.3 or greater.

Other Requirements

- The SUST+MSCP program requires a minimum of 147 credits to graduate, including all 39 credits of the MSCP degree.
- Students can take up to 12 credits of graduate-level courses during their undergraduate study.
- Graduate tuition and fees will apply once the undergraduate degree is awarded, and after students officially matriculate into the graduate portion of the SUST+MSCP program.
- To stay in the SUST+MSCP program, students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and a GPA of 3.0 or higher in graduate level courses. Students whose GPA falls below 3.0 will be placed on program probation at the end of the semester.
- Students who do not complete the SUST+ MSCP program and decide to earn the traditional SUST degree only, must satisfy [SUST degree requirements](#).
- Students admitted in the SUST+MSCP program will automatically be admitted to the MSCP program immediately after undergraduate degree conferral.
- Students who are unable to immediately enter the MSCP program will not be guaranteed graduate admissions to Marxe School and are subject to the general graduate admission process.
