Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship

The Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship is an upperdivision honors program designed to attract highly qualified minority students and others with a demonstrated commitment to eradicating racial disparities. The selected students will be those interested in discovering how to pursue a Ph.D. in more than 20 select fields in the humanities and social sciences.

The program's goal is to produce higher education professionals and diversify faculties at colleges and universities around the country.

The Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship provides students with faculty mentors, research experience, and seminars in which Fellows hear from faculty oblor about their experiences as academics, and in which Fellows discuss their own research and academic progress. The program also helps students take practical steps toward graduate study: they receive assistance preparing for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE), choosing graduate schools, drafting personal statements for their applications, and obtaining suitable faculty recommendation letters.

Mellon Fellows receive stipends for up to four semesters, as well as a maximum of two summer research fellowship stipends. Funding is also available to assist students in repaying undergraduate student loans while they are in an approved Ph.D. program.

Eligibility and Requirements

You may apply for the Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship if you are a full-time student in the second semester of your sophomore (45–60 credits) or junior (60-84 credits) year and can show evidence of solid academic achievement. The program is open to all students who are interested in pursuing graduate studies in one of the approved fields, although underrepresented minorities, including African Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans are particularly encouraged. Selected applicants will have a personal interview.

How to Apply

- 1. Fill out the Application Form. Personal and financial information on the form is confidential and is not used as a criterion for membership.
- 2. Write a personal statement in which you describe your research interests, personal plans and professional goals. The statement should be no more than two pages, typed and double-spaced, with your name and student ID number at the top of each page. Please attach the statement to the Application Form.
- 3. Ask two Brooklyn College faculty members one in your major department and one in another department) to write a letter of recommendation. Request that the letter be submitted to Professor Lynda Day, Lday@brooklyn.cuny.edu. You should ensure that your recommendation letters are submitted.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis beginning in the fall of each year, with interviews during the spring semester, and decisions by the middle of the spring semester.
