



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

A. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

Sending College: Kingsborough Community College (KCC)

Department: Behavioral Sciences

Program: Education Studies – Birth-2nd Grade concentration

Degree: A.S.

Receiving College: Brooklyn College (BC)

Department: Early Childhood Education/Art Education, hereafter, ECAE

Program: Early Childhood Education Teacher (Birth-grade 2)/Dual-ECE Teacher/Special Education (Birth-grade 2)

B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Completion of the A.S. degree. Pursuant to University policy, students who have earned a City University Associate of Science (A.S.) degree will be deemed to have automatically fulfilled the lower division liberal arts and science distribution requirements for a baccalaureate degree. However, students may be asked to complete courses required by Brooklyn College's requirements that was not part of the student's associate degree program. In such cases, any coursework required will be applied towards the total number of credits normally required for the baccalaureate degree. Applicants will follow the standard admissions process, which includes completing a transfer application.

Students must meet the following requirements to be accepted into the Early Childhood Education program at Brooklyn College:

- Grade of C or better in freshman composition, its equivalent, or a higher-level English course;
- Successful completion of a 3-credit college-level math course, MAT 900 or MAT 9B0; Students who do not complete the MAT 900 or MAT 9B0 with a minimum grade of "C" at KCC, will have to take MATH 1006 at Brooklyn College.
- A cumulative GPA of 2.80 or higher in liberal arts and science courses;
- A cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher in all early childhood courses;
- A score of 80% or higher on the ECAE department's math proficiency exam.
- DOI and/or DOE finger printing must be completed and cleared.
- Purchase ePortfolio software after being accepted to Brooklyn College.

Also, graduates of the A.S. degree program who have not completed at least one year of foreign language study (or established an equivalent proficiency) may be asked to complete six (6) to eight (8) credits of foreign language coursework (or establish an equivalent proficiency) in addition to their normal degree requirements. Proficiency may be established based upon high school coursework, native language abilities, or examination.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

- A maximum of 6 credits towards College Option (Note: College Option requirement will be clarified once student transfers).

***Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60**

***Total credits required for the B.A. in ECAE: 120**

C. Course Equivalences and / Transfer Credit Awarded

KCC graduates who complete the A.S. in Education Studies – Birth-2nd Grade concentration will receive 60 credits toward the B.A. in Early Childhood Education Teacher (Birth to grade 2) in the Early Childhood Education/Art Education Department (ECAE) at Brooklyn College.

Transferred credits will be applied to the Baccalaureate degree as course specific transfer credits and electives. Students should meet with a transfer advisor who will review their transcripts to ensure appropriate placement within the program.

D. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying, or terminating the agreement:

The sending and receiving departments at each college commit to meeting regularly to review and revise this articulation agreement in response to programmatic, curricular, and disciplinary changes. Receiving department agrees to update the course equivalencies in CUNYFirst within 90 business days from the date of signature.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

We will use the CUNY Institutional Research Database to track our transferring students (i.e., progress, GPA, retention, and graduation).

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the KCC and BC websites. Transfer advisors at KCC will promote this agreement with eligible students, as will KCC's recruiters who work with potential students both in the high schools and in the wider community. When

possible both programs will coordinate to provide information sessions to students on the subject of transferring either virtually or in person. Each fall and spring graduating majors in KCC-Education Studies EC will be provided with early enrollment forms to facilitate their transition into BC-ECAE.

E. Additional Information (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)

EC (Birth to 2nd Grade) majors at Brooklyn College have grade minimums for courses before they can proceed to the next “tier” of courses. Student must complete each tier of classes with an average grade of B and no grade below a C before they can register for the next tier of classes (see tiers listed below). KCC students must maintain a “B” average in major courses, with no grade lower than a C. Students who fail to maintain the grade minimum at KCC will be required to re-take the course(s) at BC in order to achieve a satisfactory grade. No course may be repeated more than once at BC.
